A quick reference guide for those engaging with Stevenage Football Club

Things To Remember...

- Treat everyone with respect and set a positive example for others
- Respect personal space and privacy
- Ensure another adult is present or within sight or hearing of an activity, or interaction with a child/young person or vulnerable adult
- Ensure any actions cannot be misinterpreted by someone else
 Challenge unacceptable behaviour
- Do not put a child, young person, vulnerable adult or yourself in a vulnerable or compromising situation
- Do not have inappropriate physical or verbal contact with others
- You must report all allegetions of suspected abuse. Do not keep it secret.

Always Remember The Four 'R's':

- Recognise
- Respond
- Refer
- Record

What To Do If...

YOU SUSPECT ABUSE...

- Are you concerned about a child/young person's or vulnerable adult's immediatewelfare (physical, emotional, sexual) or do you suspect neglect?
- Do not delay, consult the person to whom you are responsible
- Advise the Club Safeguarding Offier (CSO), the Academy Safeguarding Officer (ASO) or the Foundation Safeguarding Officer (FSO)

If appropriate after consultation with the above, contact the Police or Social Services

AN ALLEGATION IS MADE ABOUT ANOTHER PERSON OR YOURSELF...

- Makes notes, record dates, times and events. Sign them and keep a copy
- Report it to the person to whom you are responsible
- Report it to either the CSO, ASO or FSO
- Only tell those who need to know

A CHILD OR YOUNG PERSON WISHES TO DISCLOSE THEY HAVE BEEN ABUSED...

- Listen, keep listening, do not question or investigate
- Do not promise confidentiality tell them it will need to be shared
- · Assure them they are not to blame
- Tell them what you are going to do and that they will be told what happens
- Make careful notes of what is said, record dates, times, events when you are told.
- Sign them and keep a copy
- Report it to the person to whom you are responsible, either the CSO, ASO or FSO
- Only pass information to those who need to know
